Problem Solving	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * This position will make decisions about operations and logistics * During high fire potential days, staffs the fire tower * Determines the location of smoke and effectively communicate by radio and phone to first responders * Maintains the fire break by annual mowing, disking and/or light dozer work; includes operation of a chain saw, tractor with brush hog, tractor with bucket loader or small dozer * Assists with prescribed burns and wildfire suppression * Performs routine maintenance on equipment 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Refers to procedures, technical aids, co-workers, or supervisors to solve routine, well-defined problems.
Interaction/Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> * During a fire event, provide coordination support between response personnel during wildland fire and prescribed burning activities * Record fire activity in the fire tower log; record fires and fire break maintenance in a GIS database. * Provide a weekly verbal update of work accomplished and possible upcoming needs in a weekly staff meeting. * Attend weekly DPW Forestry staff meeting; monthly division safety meetings and trainings; and After Action Reviews 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Interaction is of a day-to-day nature, requiring a professional manner, customer services skills, common courtesy, and tact.
